




When people respond to **iterative** moral dilemmas




1. People **switch** their judgment when victims are the **same** but **not** with **different** victims



2. **When** deciding multiple shocks **all at once** balance of **judgments stays the same**



3. **When** decisions are **sequential** people **spread** harm **around more!**



4. **Sequential** decisions lead to **fairer** spread
